Trying to See Too Much in One Trip

One of the most common mistakes couples make is trying to fit too many destinations into a short honeymoon. Safari itineraries often look efficient on paper, but constant movement can quickly become tiring. You don't need a long list of locations to make a safari memorable – there is so much beauty and life to discover in any given spot.

Safari travel typically involves small aircraft flights, game drives and early mornings, and moving camps every two nights can quickly chip away at the relaxed atmosphere most couples want from their honeymoon. In reality, fewer locations often create a better experience as you can settle into the rhythm of the bush and enjoy more spontaneous moments together.

A slower itinerary, such as one with two safari camps, usually works best for a 10-to-12-day honeymoon.

Choosing the Wrong Type of Safari Lodge

Not all [safari lodges](#) are designed with honeymooners in mind. Some camps cater to [family safaris](#) or larger tour groups, which can change the atmosphere significantly.

What Couples Should Look For

On your honeymoon, it is the little details which can make your trip even more special. Look for features like private decks or plunge pools for ultimate indulgence, or outdoor baths and star beds to immerse you in the magical East African atmosphere. Room location also matters more than many people realise. The most romantic rooms are often those furthest from communal areas such as bars or dining tents. If privacy is important, we would recommend requesting a quiet room location during booking.

Many couples leave for their safari immediately after their wedding. After months of planning a busy celebration, the combination of long-haul flights and early game drives can feel overwhelming. A better approach is to begin with a gentle first night in a gateway city, such as Nairobi or Arusha, before flying into the safari camps. This slower start allows you to recover from travel and adjust to the safari schedule, which often starts before sunrise to maximise wildlife viewing opportunities.

You have spent long enough racing around to meet deadlines, take some time to breathe before jumping into the next adventure.

Forgetting That Safari Days Are Active

Many travellers assume a safari will feel like a relaxing resort holiday. In reality, safari days are active and can be quite structured.

What a Typical Safari Day Consists Of

A typical day on safari follows a rhythm that is both structured and immersive. The days typically begin with a very early morning, with sunrise game drives offering the chance to see predators and other wildlife when they are most active. Around midday, the pace slows considerably with time to relax, unwind by the pool or in your private suite during the hottest period of the day. As temperatures begin to cool, the afternoon brings more opportunities to head out on a game drive, often extending into the early evening when the landscape transforms into a golden glow around sunset.

After a packed day, the evening may bring another memorable safari tradition, such as sundowners in the bush. This lets you enjoy a drink or two served against a dramatic sunset, followed by a leisurely dinner back at camp - often under the stars.
